Please explain how this grant will help deliver on the country's readiness needs as identified above and build on

institutions, processes or existing work already underway in the country (maximum 500 words) One of the gaps Peru needs to address to tackle climate change's impacts and opportunities is increase the accreditation of multiple National Implementing Entities (NIE) in order to attend the prioritized sectors established by the GCF and the NDA. PROFONANPE, which focus on interventions in forest and agriculture activities, is the only NIE in Peru and it is accredited for micro projects (less than US\$ 20 millions) and for a particular function which is project management. Nevertheless, climate change mitigation and adaptation requires not only enough resources to implement the designed activities but also the ability to simultaneously tackle the problem from several dimensions. Therefore, is necessary to increment the accreditation of national entities considering different functions, scales, projects scopes so that as a country we could consider the presentation of a variety of projects that address the climate change issues that Peru has to face as a vulnerable country to the climate change effects. Thus, this grant will be circumscribed to the accreditation of direct access entities.
