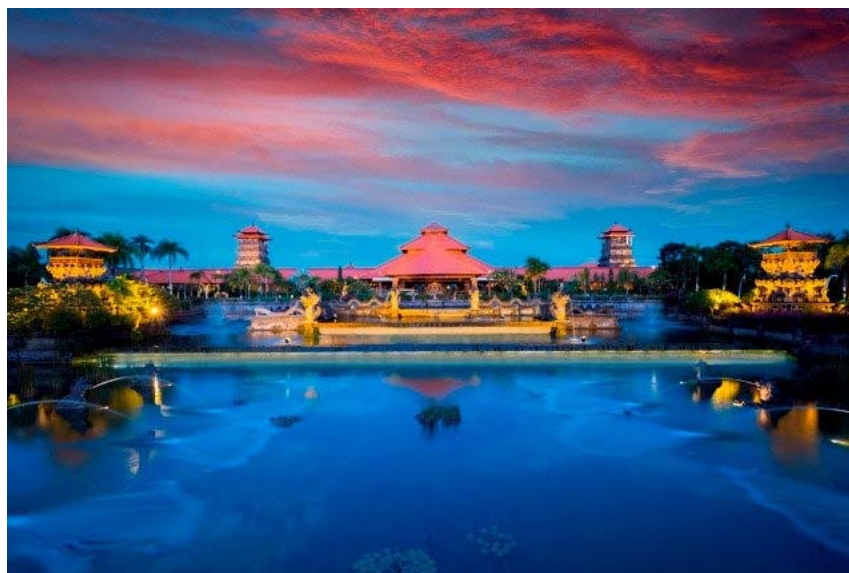

VISA & IMMIGRATION

- Depending on your passport, below are the different travel visa requirements for entry into Indonesia:
 - a) No Visa required (majority of countries – free entry, 30 days validity, not extendable)
 - b) Visa on Arrival (USD 35.00, 30 days validity, extendable once for 30 days)
 - c) Visa needed (apply abroad before arriving in Indonesia)

- Please note the [official procedure](#) for the countries whose citizens require a visa.

ACCOMMODATION ARRANGEMENTS

- All sponsored participants have rooms booked and paid for by GCF at the Ayodya Resort.
- Non-sponsored participants are encouraged to book the same hotel as the Structured Dialogue will take place at this venue.
- Lunch and tea/coffee breaks will be provided for all participants from 26–29 April 2017.
- Sponsored participants are given a daily subsistence allowance (DSA) for the duration of their stay. Note that the cost of the hotel and lunches will be deducted from the DSA.

GUEST RECEPTION EVENTS

- GCF will hold a welcome reception on Wednesday, 26 April at 18:00.
- The Government of Indonesia will host a welcome reception on Thursday, 27 April at 18:00.

TRANSPORTATION FROM & TO AIRPORT

- There will be an information desk at the airport for all participants upon arrival.
- For Ministers and GCF Board Members, the Ministry of Finance of Indonesia has arranged transportation to the venue and will be welcoming these officials at the airport.
- For all other participants, below are several options for transportation to the venue:

I. Hotel Airport Pick-up Service

The Ayodya Resort Hotel provides airport roundtrip pick-up services to the airport. This service can be arranged by the hotel and must be booked in advance:

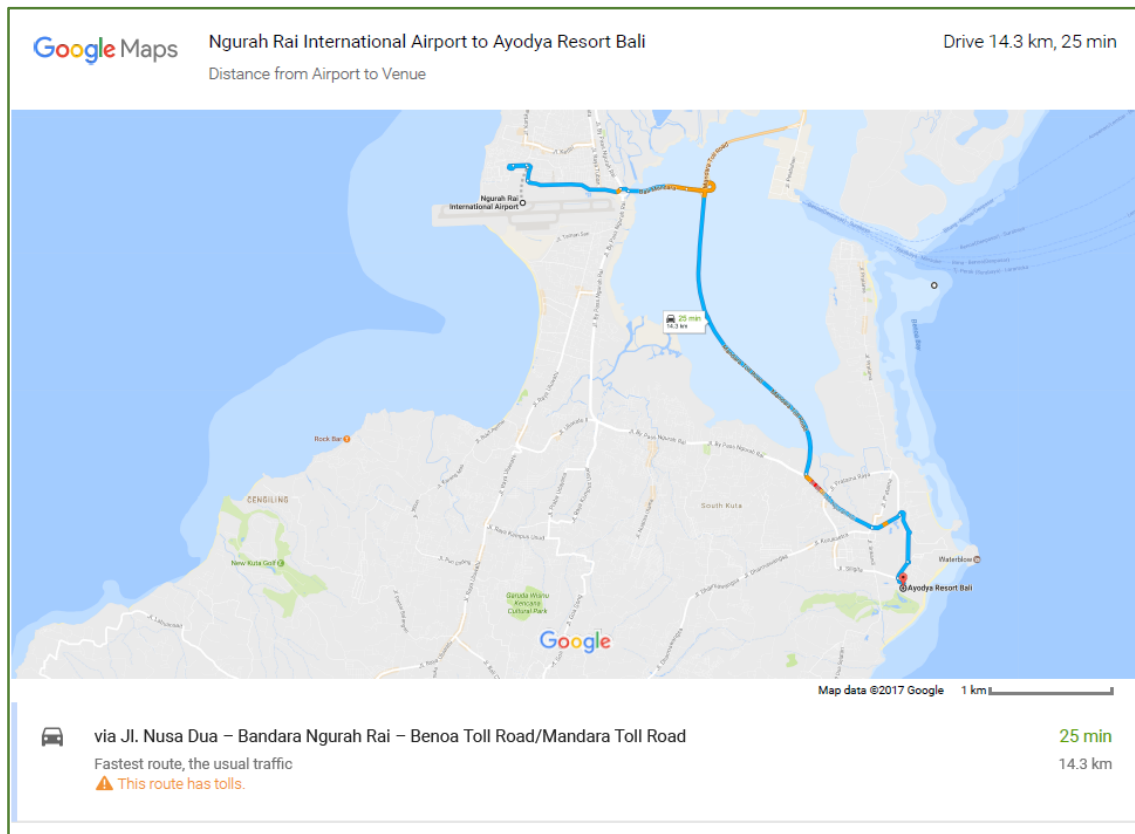

II. Taxi

The official taxi counter is located outside the Arrivals Hall at Ngurah Rai International Airport (exit arrivals, turn right). Tell the attendant your destination, pay the fare and proceed to the taxi with the receipt. Below is a list of recommended taxis:

GENERAL INFORMATION

Time Difference

The local time in Bali is 8 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +8).

Weather

Indonesia is distinctly tropical. The weather in Bali in April is usually warm and humid with temperatures ranging between 23 – 31 degrees Celsius and the relative humidity is about 80%. All event sessions will be held in air-conditioned venues.

Currency

Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) is the official currency of Indonesia. It is accepted at regular stores and restaurants. Most hotels, restaurants and souvenirs shops accept credit cards.

Electricity

The standard used plug and socket in Bali is a two-pin plug (round), as used in Europe (230 V, 50 Hz, power sockets type C/F).

Mobile Phones

Local mobile phones with pre-paid SIM cards are widely available and easily topped up with credit. These pre-paid mobile phone SIM cards range in price from daily IDR 15,000 (approx. USD 1.50) with no calling credit. Data speeds of 3G and faster are the norm across Bali. Data plans cost about IDR 150,000 – 200,000 (approx. USD 15.00 – 20.00) for 4GB of data with 30 days validity.
