

Annex VIII: Terms of reference for the selection of the host countries/cities for GCF regional presence

I. Introduction

- 1. These terms of reference outline the objective, eligibility and evaluation criteria, and selection process for identifying an initial set of host countries/cities for the Green Climate Fund (GCF) regional presence. This process supports the implementation of decision B.41/10, which calls for the establishment of a regional presence to enhance accessibility, efficiency and country ownership, and does not prejudge the potential for future expansion informed by operational experience, evolving needs and demand, and continued Board guidance.
- 2. The process reflects guidance from the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the Paris Agreement and is intended to ensure a transparent, inclusive, and competitive approach to selection

II. Objective

The objective is to select an initial set of host countries/cities in which to establish regional offices and potentially "outposts" as part of GCF regional presence. The process will consider proposals submitted by countries that are Parties to the UNFCCC and eligible based on the criteria, and will be guided by operational, institutional, and strategic priorities as defined by the Board and the updated Strategic Plan for the GCF 2024-2027.

III. Call for proposals

- 4. Parties to the UNFCCC interested in hosting an office* of GCF and eligible based on the criteria are invited to submit a proposal by completing the form in appendix I that addresses the eligibility and evaluation criteria outlined in this terms of reference. Submission may be accompanied by documentary information providing evidence of how the country/city meets the requirements.
- 5. Submission of a proposal does not imply selection or commitment by GCF. All submissions will be evaluated transparently against the criteria, and final decisions on host country/city selection will rest with the Board.
- Recognizing both the regional groupings referenced in decision B.41/10[†] and the Secretariat's updated structure endorsed by the Board in decision B.40/01, [‡] the call for proposal is being launched without prejudgement of any future adjustments to the geographic configuration of the regional presence of GCF, which shall be informed by the assessment of the actual proposals received and be considered by the Board in early December 2025.
- 7. To facilitate planning and effective coordination of the selection process, countries that intend to submit a proposal are kindly requested to notify the Secretariat of their intention to do so by 15 August 2025.
- 8. Final proposals must be submitted by 19 September 2025 and emailed to regionalpresence@gcfund.org and secretarytotheboard@gcfund.org.

IV. Eligibility criteria

9. To be considered, a proposal must meet all of the following minimum requirements:

V. Weighted evaluation criteria

- Eligible proposals will be assessed using weighted evaluation criteria organized into two categories, reflecting both operational and institutional priorities:
- (a) **Meeting work objectives for regional presence** focuses on the capacity of the proposed location to support the core functions of GCF, including programming, engagement and delivery; and
- (b) **Recruiting and retaining a world-class workforce** addresses factors critical to ensuring the long-term viability and effectiveness of regional operations by enabling GCF to attract, support and retain skilled staff.
- While eligibility criteria establish the minimum standards for consideration, evaluation criteria serve to differentiate among eligible proposals based on the quality and strength of the enabling environment. Assessments will be informed by independent metrics, verified data, and formal commitments outlined in the submissions.

Appendix II: Notes on legal status, privileges, immunities and exceptions

- 1. Establishing a regional presence requires careful consideration of legal frameworks, particularly regarding privileges, immunities and exemptions. Securing the necessary recognition and legal protections for the organization and its representatives is essential to ensure the smooth operations of GCF. It is also essential to ensure that GCF is able to discharge its duty of care.
- 2. As an international organization, GCF requires certain privileges, immunities and exemptions to carry out its functions and mandate effectively for the benefit of the whole Fund, without interference. These privileges, immunities and exemptions are essential to protect GCF assets, ensure the security of its officials, and facilitate its operations. These would include, but are not limited to:
- (a) Recognition of the legal personality and legal capacity of GCF;
- (b) Immunity from every form of legal process;
- (c) Inviolability of its premises and archives;
- (d) Exemption from taxation and customs duties; and
- (e) Immunity from search, requisition, confiscation and expropriation or any other form of seizure by executive or legislative action.
- 3. The privileges, immunities and exemptions of GCF representatives (members and alternate Board members, Board members' advisers, officials, as well as experts) would include, but are not limited to:
- (a) Exemption for them and their dependents, from immigration restrictions and facilitated entry into, exit from, and residence in the territory of the host country;
- (b) Exemption from taxation;
- (c) Immunity from all forms of legal process and arrest for acts performed as part of their functions to GCF (except where GCF waives that immunity);
- (d) Same repatriation facilities in times of international crises, together with their dependents, as are accorded to diplomatic envoys; and
- $\ensuremath{\text{(e)}} \qquad \text{Freedom of speech in the exercise of their functions.}$
- 4. The existence of a bilateral agreement alone on privileges and immunities with GCF is not sufficient for the establishment of GCF regional presence, which would require additional privileges and immunities relevant to the establishment of a regional presence.

Host country agreements

To establish a regional presence, GCF must negotiate and conclude a host country agreement with the country where operations will be based. When entering into this agreement, the host country will, among other things, recognize the legal capacity of GCF to operate in its jurisdiction, including its ability to contract, acquire property and hire staff, as outlined in paragraph 7 of the Governing Instrument for the GCF.
