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# Status of the GCF pipeline, including the status of Project Preparation Facility requests

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## **Summary**

This document provides an update on the GCF pipeline of projects and programmes, including the status of Project Preparation Facility applications, for the reporting period of 1 May to 31 July 2021.

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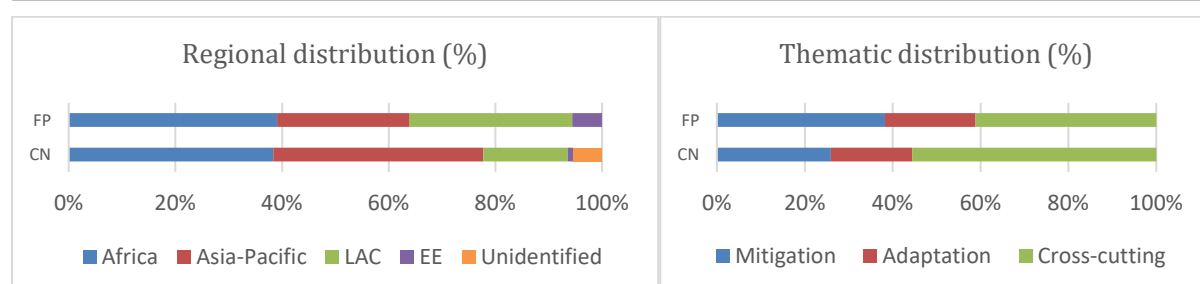
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## Executive summary: snapshot of the GCF pipeline

This executive summary provides a snapshot of the GCF pipeline as at 31 July 2021, comprising funding proposals and concept notes submitted to the Secretariat. The key tables and figures below show the sectoral, regional and thematic breakdown of funding proposals and concept notes as well as the current status of active requests for proposal and the simplified approval process (SAP) pilot scheme.

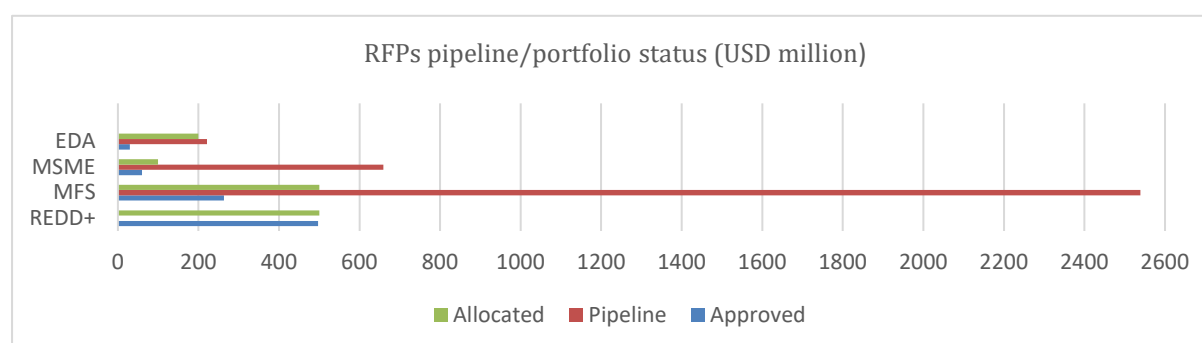

## I. Overall status of the GCF pipeline

### 1.1 Funding proposal pipeline

1. At its eleventh meeting, the Board requested the Secretariat to provide an update of the pipeline portfolio and to submit it for information to the Board as part of the documentation submitted for every Board meeting.<sup>1</sup> This status report responds to the Board’s request and provides an update for the reporting period of 1 May to 31 July 2021.

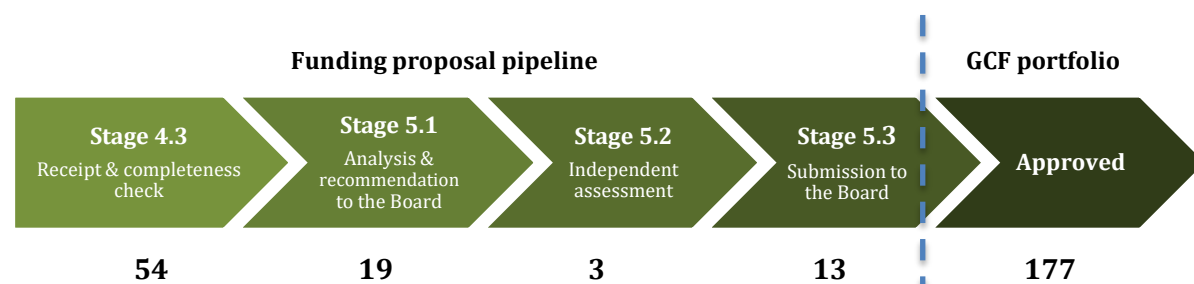
2. As at 31 July 2021,<sup>2</sup> the GCF pipeline comprises 89 public and private sector funding proposals, which request a total of USD 6.4 billion in GCF funding to support projects and programmes totalling USD 24.3 billion when taking co-financing into account.<sup>3</sup>

3. Table 1 presents an overview of the pipeline, broken down into different sectors, and figure 1 presents the status of the funding proposals in the pipeline with respect to their level of progress in the GCF due diligence process. The geographical distribution of the pipeline is presented in figures 2 and 3.<sup>4</sup> In addition, a further breakdown of the geographical distribution of the pipeline by the least developed countries (LDCs), small island developing States (SIDS) and African States can be found in figures 3.1, 3.2 and 3.3, respectively.

**Figure 1: Status of funding proposal progress**



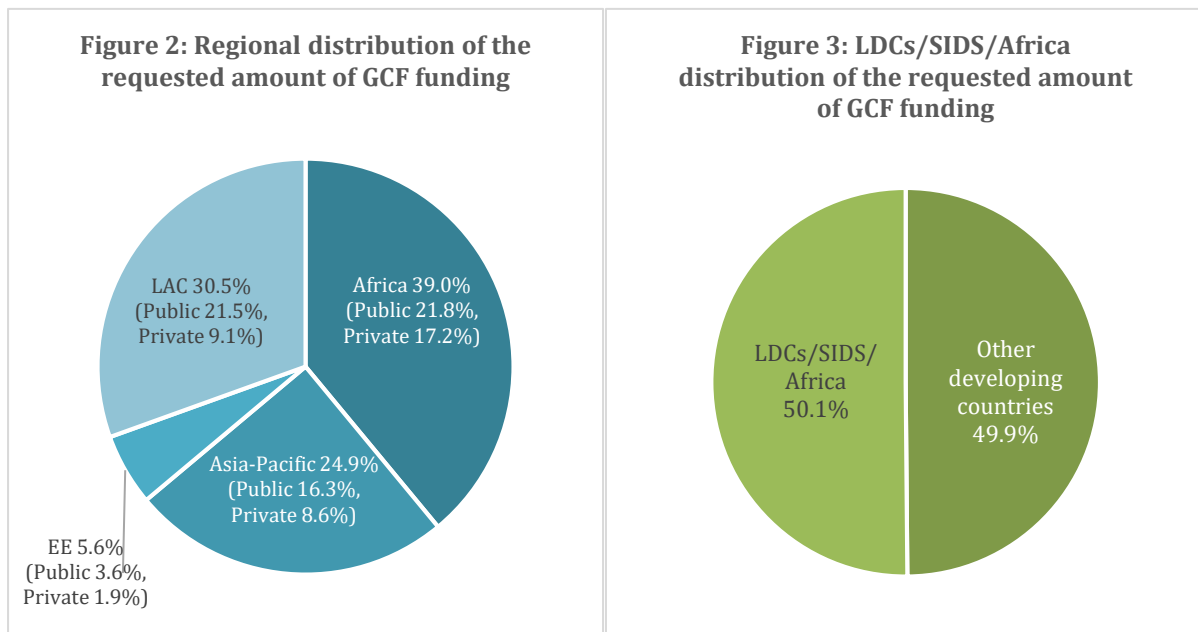

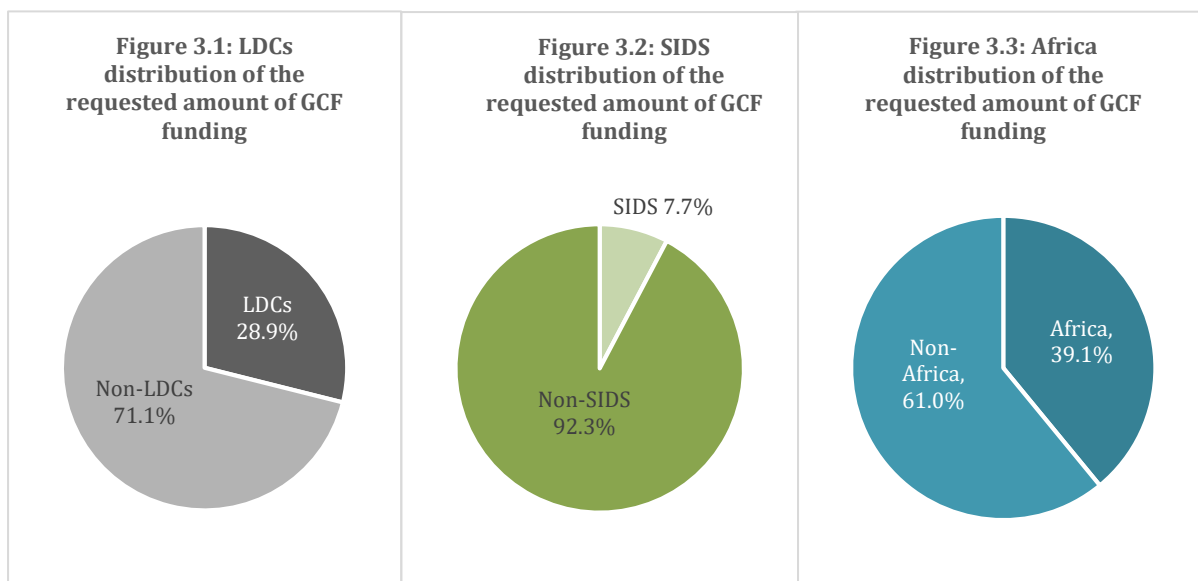

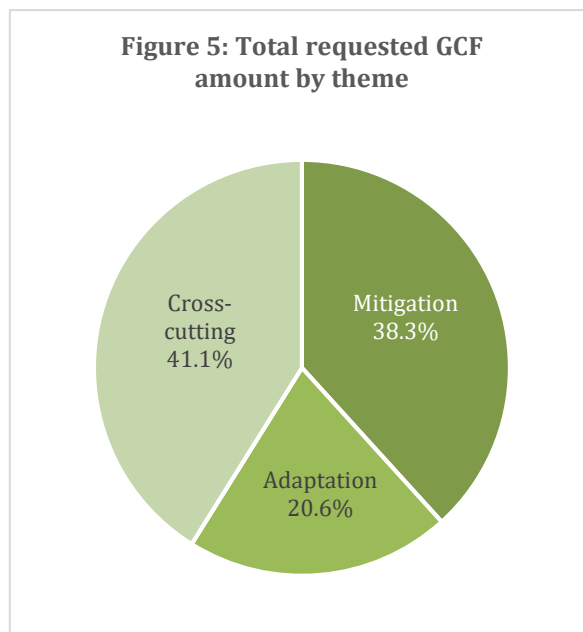
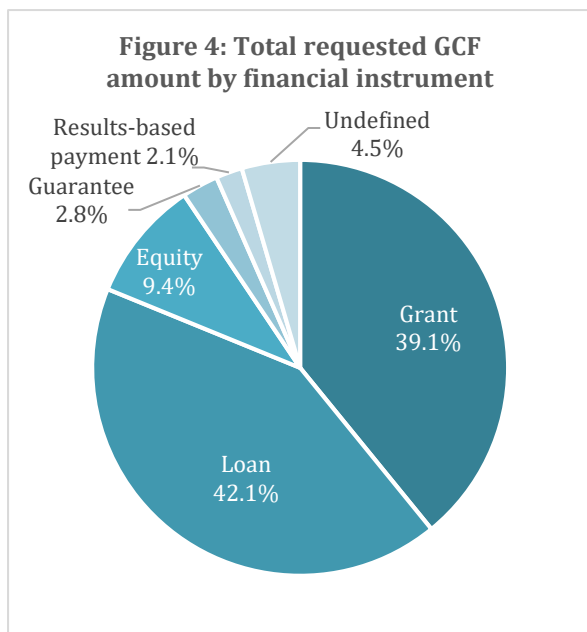

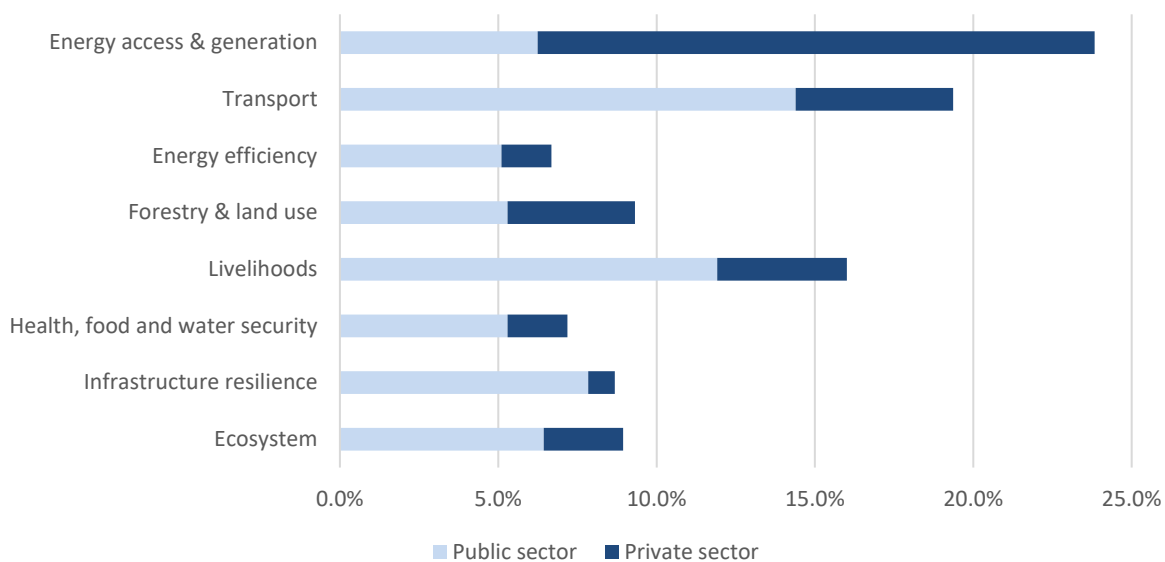
4. The distribution of the pipeline by financial instrument and theme is provided in figures 4 and 5.<sup>5</sup>

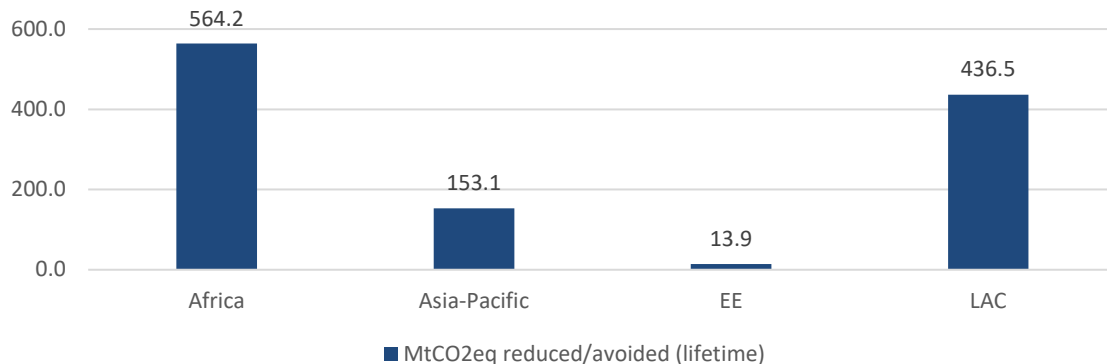
**Figure 6: Requested GCF funding by results area (percentage)<sup>a</sup>**

5. The distribution of the requested funding of the pipeline across the eight results areas of GCF is presented in figure 6.

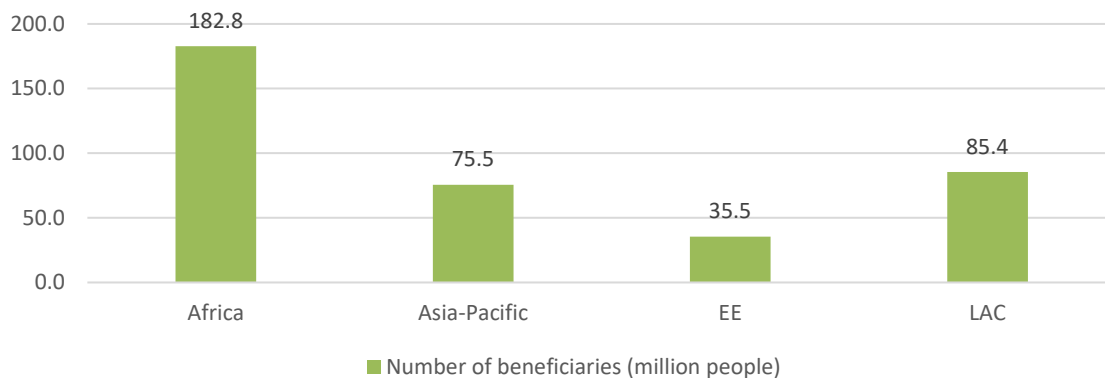
**Figure 7: Estimated climate impact potential by region (total: 1,167.7 MtCO<sub>2</sub>eq)<sup>a</sup>**

7. The list of the funding proposals in the pipeline at different stages of the review process is presented in annex I. Many of the submitted funding proposals were drawn from the country programme briefs and entity work programmes, the status of which is also presented in annex I.

8. The average time taken for funding proposals during the reporting period, from the date of first funding proposal submission to the date of first feedback from the Secretariat, was 55 days for all accredited entities (AEs), and 56 days for direct access entities (DAEs). The average time taken of all approved projects since B.11, from the first submission of the funding proposal for Board approval, was 346 days for all AEs, and 281 days for DAEs. This has led to subsequent disbursements of USD 2,018 million (excluding AE fees) for all AEs, including USD 253 million for DAEs, as at 31 July 2021.

## 1.2 Concept note pipeline

9. The GCF pipeline for concept notes as at the reporting date is shown in table 2.

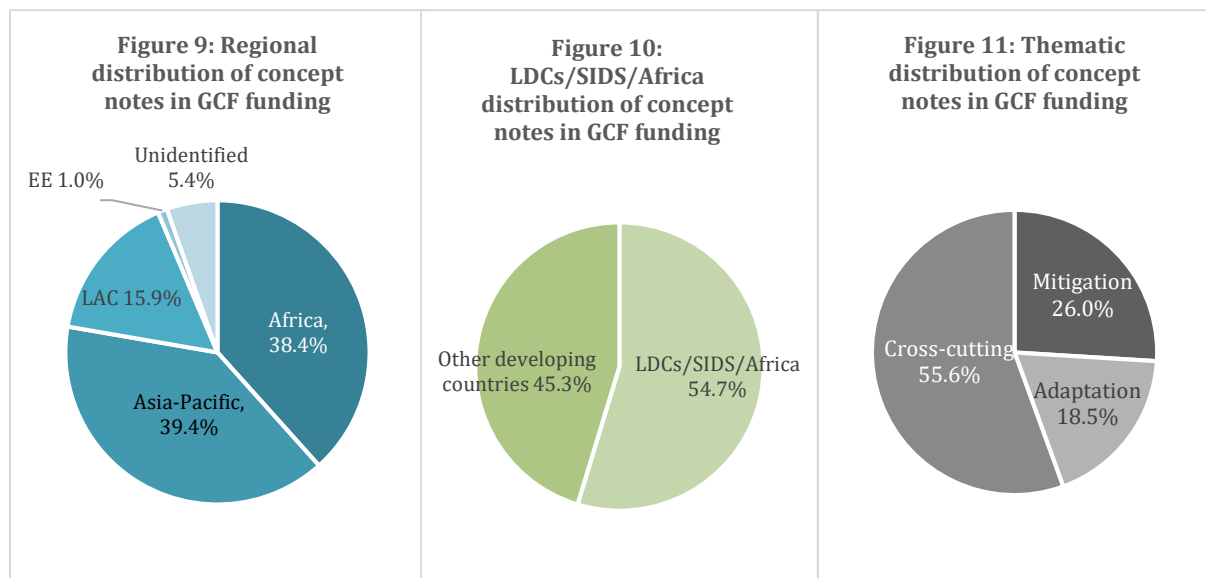
10. Of the 350 concept notes registered in the GCF pipeline, 67 have subsequently requested project preparation support from the Project Preparation Facility (PPF) and details are included in section II below.

11. Figures 9, 10<sup>6</sup> and 11 present the geographical distribution, including the distribution of funding to LDCs/SIDS/Africa, and the thematic distribution of the requested GCF funding for the concept notes.

12. During the reporting period, the average time taken from the date of the concept note submission to the date when feedback is delivered was 31.8 days for all AEs and 28.6 days for DAEs.

## II. Status of the pipeline of projects from direct access entities and the Project Preparation Facility

13. The GCF pipeline for DAEs as at the reporting date is shown in table 3.

14. The Secretariat continues to work closely with DAEs and national designated authorities (NDAs)/focal points in developing their pipelines of proposals to be submitted to GCF.

15. At the date of reporting, the Secretariat was working on 65 active PPF applications with letters of no objection from the NDAs/focal points, of which 39 (60 per cent) are from DAEs. Further information on this pipeline is as follows:

- (a) Of these 65 applications:
- (i) Forty-three (43) have been approved, including 30 (69 per cent) from DAEs. As at the reporting date, the total approved amount for PPF applications was USD 27.3 million, of which USD 19.4 million had been disbursed:
    - (1) Of the 43 approved PPFs, thirteen (13) funding proposals developed through PPF support have now been submitted to the Secretariat, 6 of these funding proposals have been approved, others are at different stages of review and revision;
  - (ii) Four (4) PPF applications entered the review and revision stage by the Secretariat following endorsement of the associated concept note by the GCF Climate Investment Committee; and
  - (iii) Eighteen (18) additional PPF applications are pending the associated underlying project concept note being strengthened and cleared as per the GCF investment criteria, to enable PPF support to be provided; and
- (b) In addition to the 65 active applications, another 39 PPF applications have been received but are not currently active due to having been withdrawn by the AEs or NDAs, or with no resubmission or communication from the AEs for more than six months. The list of all 104 PPF applications, including those approved, is presented in annex II.
16. Several concerted actions were taken towards improving and expanding the PPF support to assist AEs, and particularly DAEs, more efficiently in the development of concept notes and funding proposals for GCF, as follows:
- (a) Two PPF service applications have been approved; both are to support DAEs in project preparation. The selected independent consultancy firms are providing preparation services to AEs. Additional applications from DAEs are being processed;
  - (b) In terms of project development technical assistance (TA) for concept notes and funding proposals via rostered professional firms, one TA assignment has been deployed to help a DAE in finalizing a funding proposal package for a LDC country in Africa. Additional TA support assignments are being discussed and processed. The Secretariat is also proactively reaching out to DAEs and NDAs on identifying potential needs as well as streamlining the TA template and process;
  - (c) Technical guidance for project development is being developed to support AEs in developing PPF applications and GCF projects. This will cover how to organize project

- preparation activities and will include cost benchmarks for different types of project development activities as well as examples of terms of reference for such studies; and
- (d) The Secretariat also provided guidance on accessing the new PPF modalities and service rosters during virtual regional dialogues in the Caribbean and in the Pacific.

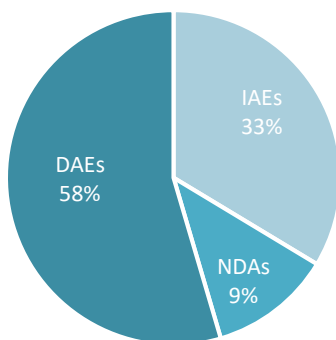
### III. Status of the simplified approval process pilot scheme

17. Since the launch of the simplified approval process (SAP) pilot scheme in November 2017, 23 projects have been approved by the Board, of which 8 are from DAEs and 3 are private sector projects. The approved portfolio of SAP projects amounts to USD 355.7 million, with GCF financing amounting to USD 208.5 million.

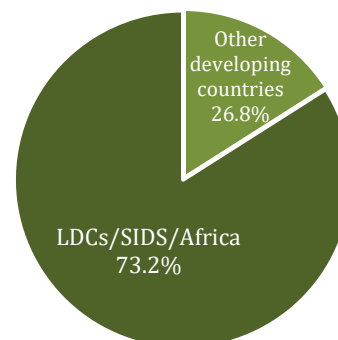
18. As of the reporting date, the SAP pipeline consists of 97 public and private sector concept notes and funding proposals. The pipeline requests GCF funding of USD 889.8 million, with a total value of approximately USD 1.2 billion when taking co-financing into account. Of the 97 public and private sector concept notes and funding proposals in the SAP pipeline, 82 are public sector proposals, consisting of 75 concept notes and 7 funding proposals. From the private sector, the SAP pipeline consists of 14 concept notes and 1 funding proposal.

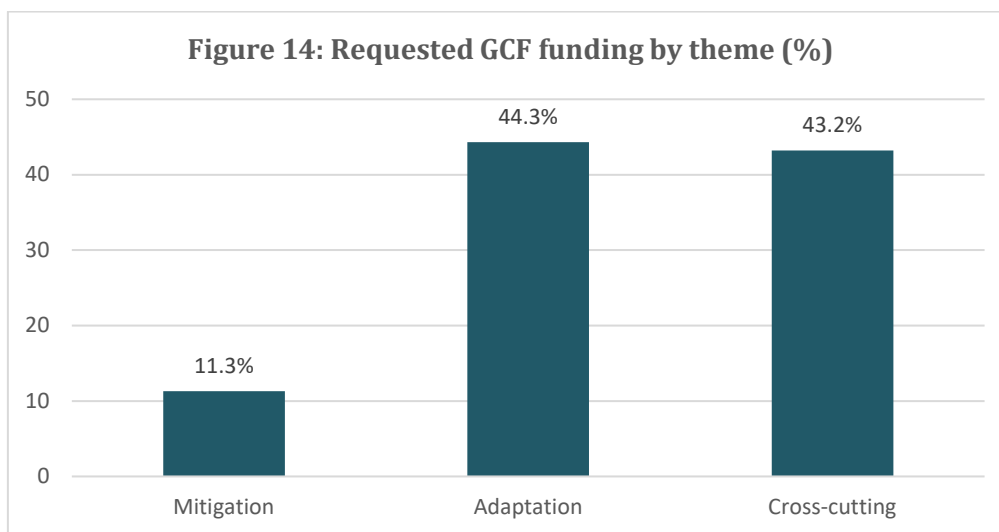


**Figure 13: Requested GCF funding by region (%)**

19. In the SAP pipeline, 67.4 per cent of the requested GCF funding is from DAEs and NDAs (see figure 12), and 73.2 per cent of the requested GCF funding is from LDCs, SIDS and African States (see figure 13).

**Figure 12. Requested GCF funding by access modality (%)**

20. Around 87.5 per cent of the requested GCF funding targets adaptation and cross-cutting results (figure 14), focusing on building the resilience of communities through food and water security measures. Many projects aim to undertake ecosystem-based adaptation for communities, while several projects propose strengthening climate information services and early warning systems. A number of projects target mitigation results through small-scale renewable energy solutions.



21. Since the twenty-nine meeting of the Board (B.29), the amount requested to GCF through the SAP has decreased by 5.4 per cent (from USD 940 million to USD 889 million).

22. The average time taken during this reporting period, from the date of an SAP concept note submission by an AE to the date when feedback is delivered from the Secretariat, is 27.5 days for all AEs, as well as for DAEs.

## **IV. Status of active requests for proposals**

### **4.1 Enhancing direct access**

23. As per decision B.10/04, the Board approved the allocation of USD 200 million for at least 10 pilot proposals under the enhancing direct access (EDA) request for proposal (RFP). GCF has approved two funding proposals under this pilot amounting to USD 30 million of GCF funding.

24. As of July 2021, there are 13 concept notes and funding proposals submitted by the DAEs under the EDA pilot. Out of those, nine (9) submissions are active, comprising 5 concept notes and 4 funding proposals, and requesting USD 161.1 million from the GCF, with the total financing amounting to USD 194.5 million. The remaining four (4) out of 13 submissions are not currently active due to having been withdrawn by the AEs or NDAs, or with no resubmission or communication from the AEs for more than six months.

25. There are currently two EDA projects expected to be presented at B.30 and one project at B.31.

### **4.2 Pilot programme to support micro, small and medium-sized enterprises**

26. Through decision B.13/22, the Board approved the micro, small and medium-sized enterprise (MSME) pilot RFP, deciding to limit GCF participation in the first tranche to USD 100 million. Following the close of the MSME RFP in August 2016 and through the competitive evaluation process, the Board has approved three funding proposals for a total of USD 60 million. The approved projects are USD 20 million for the “Business loan programme for GHG emissions reduction” proposal (FP028) submitted by Mongolia-based XacBank, to which GCF

has disbursed its total commitment; USD 20 million for the “Low emissions climate resilient agriculture risk sharing facility for MSMEs” proposal (FP048) submitted by the Inter-American Development Bank to be implemented in Guatemala and Mexico; and USD 20 million for the “Program on Affirmative Finance Action for Women in Africa (AFAWA): Financing climate resilient agricultural practices in Ghana” proposal (FP114) submitted by the African Development Bank.

27. An overall review of private sector RFPs will be presented to the Board at B.30, in the context of an assessment of the performance and results of all GCF RFPs.

### 4.3 Mobilizing funds at scale

28. In accordance with decision B.16/03, the Board approved the mobilizing funds at scale (MFS) pilot RFP in 2017, allocating up to USD 500 million to innovative, high-impact projects and programmes that mobilize private sector investment in climate change activities. The RFP was open to AEs and non-accredited entities and attracted 350 concept note submissions from more than 70 countries, with an estimated request for GCF financing amounting to USD 18 billion. The Board has approved USD 60 million for the project “Espejo de Tarapacá” (FP115) submitted by MUFG Bank, Ltd.; USD 25 million for the project “Arbaro Sustainable Forestry Fund” in Ecuador, Ethiopia, Ghana, Paraguay, Peru, Sierra Leone and Uganda submitted by MUFG Bank, Ltd. (FP128); and USD 9.9 million under the SAP for “Scaling Smart, Solar, Energy Access Microgrids in Haiti” submitted by the Nordic Environment Finance Corporation (SAP013). At B.27, the Board approved two additional MFS projects, namely USD 18.5 million for the project “Global Subnational Climate Fund (SnCF Global) – Technical Assistance (TA) Facility” submitted by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (FP151) and USD 150 million for the “Global Subnational Climate Fund (SnCF Global) – Equity” submitted by Pegasus Capital Advisors (FP152). The SnCF Global targets a total of 42 countries across the Eastern Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, Africa and Asia-Pacific regions.

29. The Secretariat continues to engage with proponents of the shortlisted projects towards developing full funding proposals for consideration by the Board. An overall review of private sector RFPs will be presented to the Board at B.30, in the context of an assessment of the performance and results of all GCF RFPs.

### 4.4 REDD-plus results-based payments

30. Through decision B.18/07, the Board allocated USD 500 million to the RFPs for a pilot programme for REDD-plus results-based payments (RBPs).

31. Under the REDD-plus Results-Based Payments Pilot Programme launched in October 2017, eight projects (FP100 for Brazil, FP110 for Ecuador, FP120 for Chile, FP121 for Paraguay, FP130 for Indonesia, FP134 for Colombia, FP142 for Argentina and FP144 for Costa Rica) have been approved by the Board at B.22, B.23, B.24, B.26 and B.27, amounting to a total GCF financing of USD 496.7 million, effectively exhausting funds under the Pilot Programme in 2020, two years ahead of schedule.

32. Four concept notes (three from the Asia-Pacific region and one from Latin America and the Caribbean) remain in the pipeline for the first phase of the RFP. If approved in their entirety, these would amount for a total of USD 350 million in RBPs. An additional three countries (two in Asia-Pacific and one in Africa) were eligible for RBPs as of 31 July 2021 according to the Lima REDD-plus Information Hub.

33. Based on recommendations by Board members in the lead-up to B.29, consultations have been taking place on the continuation of the RFP into a second phase. There is a possibility that this second phase could require updated terms of reference and scorecard. Consultations

have been taking place in the form of interviews, an expert meeting and a questionnaire, and additional consultations may be needed to finalize the terms of reference and scorecard for a second phase of the RFP for adoption by the Board.

34. To fill the gap in the provision of RBPs and to respond to continuing demand (including the four above-mentioned concept notes) while allowing for the Board to update and adopt revised terms of reference, a two-pronged approach is proposed at B.30:<sup>7</sup>

- (a) In the short term, an allocation of up to USD 100 million is proposed to supplement funds allocated to the pilot programme by decision B.18/06 for adoption by the Board at B.30, with the aim of enabling eligible countries to access REDD-plus RBPs using the pilot programme; and
- (b) In the medium term, draft terms of reference are to be presented at B.30 for a second phase of the RFP that can be reviewed by the Board for further guidance.<sup>8</sup> The draft contains a range of options compiled through consultations with stakeholders to date, with a view to establishing a second phase of the GCF REDD-plus RBP programme before the end of 2022.

## V. Status of pipeline knowledge management

35. By decision B.17/09, annex III, the Board requested the Secretariat to develop an online concept note and funding proposal submission portal and to improve data management and analytics, including, for example, the AE submission portal and the NDA portal. Responding to the decision, the Secretariat has enhanced the quality and transparency of the project pipeline by providing more advanced knowledge management systems to the public, stakeholders and internal users.

36. Based on lessons learned from the SAP online submission system since early May 2019, the Secretariat has been working on improving the current system to be more user friendly as well as expanding the online submission system to accept regular concept notes and funding proposals. As a result, the updated online submission system for all proposals – both SAP and proposals under the standard approval process – will be ready to be piloted in late 2021, and is expected to be fully operational soon after adjusting the system based on feedback from the entities during the pilot launching. Additionally, the updated online submission system will utilize GCF enterprise-wide taxonomy to facilitate the identification and classification of concept note and funding proposal content effectively and efficiently.

37. To further automate the cross-Secretariat assessment workflow of concept notes and funding proposals, and to enhance transparency and collaboration with AEs, the Secretariat has developed an online tracking system that provides real-time information on progress and helps the Secretariat to identify any bottlenecks in the review process. The tracking system was piloted in the second quarter of 2020, and it has been fully operational for funding proposals since the first half of 2021, communicating with the entities directly via the system.

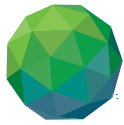

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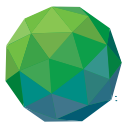
