Dear Madam/Sir,

I am writing to you to express our commitment to support "Building the resilience of Togo's national health system and vulnerable communities to climate-sensitive health outcomes" project in Togo as described in the Funding Proposal submitted by the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, that is proposed to the Green Climate Fund (GCF) for funding.

The Ministry of Health, Public Hygiene, Universal Health Coverage and Insurance (MSHPCSUA) is a key implementing institution across all four project components. Under Component 1, MSHPCSUA will establish and institutionalise the Health Early Warning System, ensuring its long-term sustainability and strengthening coordination with the Meteorological Agency (ANAMET) and the Civil Protection Agency (ANPC). Under Component 2, the Ministry will formally establish Climate Change Units at central and regional levels, equip them with essential resources, support regional learning exchanges, and train Community Health Workers on climate-health linkages. Under Component 3, where most MSHPCSUA investments are concentrated, the Ministry will operationalise a maintenance financing mechanism, strengthen private-sector collaboration, and improve service delivery through continued rollout of the Logistics Management Information System, sentinel sites, fever clinics, enhanced diagnostics, and medicines procurement. Under Component 4, MSHPCSUA will implement interpersonal communication campaigns to support behaviour change and community engagement.

This is to confirm the in-kind contribution of the MSHPCSUA to co-finance the project "Building the resilience of Togo's national health system and vulnerable communities to climate-sensitive health outcomes", should the proposal be approved, with a total value of [5 794 452 €].



The in-kind contributions comprise time provided by technical and support staff of MSHPCSUA, complemented by MSHPCSUA-financed consultants with environmental expertise. MSHPCSUA will further contribute equipment, including IT and communication tools, as well as resources for maintenance activities. The largest share of in-kind contributions will be provided through construction works, notably the establishment of regional maintenance centers. In addition, travel, communication, and meeting- and event-related costs will be covered.
