Objectives

The Structured Dialogue is intended for the National Designated Authorities (NDAs) and Focal Points of 14 countries in Eastern Europe and Central Asia, Accredited Entities (AEs), Readiness delivery partners as well as to representatives of civil society organizations and other relevant stakeholders.

The Programme will focus on:

- (1) Indicative timeline and initial elements of anticipated engagement with the GCF, including readiness support, country programmes, and project ideas;
- (2) Initial plan to advance the accreditation of direct access entities which have the potential to work in partnership with governments to implement and co-finance adaptation & mitigation programming priorities;
- (3) Identification of potential regional and national priorities that can be translated into pipelines of projects fit for the GCF, together with the engagement of diverse partners, including potential DAEs
